### **THINKING SKILLS**


Problem solving and decision making; use initiative to find solutions.

### Investing in the workforce

The businesses in the Trades sector have a common desire to assist their staff with training and all are willing to invest in professional development of their employees if there is a willingness and genuine commitment to learn. This could be on-the-job training, apprenticeship training, or study at degree level to progress.





The trades are suited to those who enjoy a practical focus – at high school it may be that the technology subjects are your passion. Consider getting involved with the Gateway programme at school to get experience in different work places.

### **At School**

NCEA Level 1 or 2 preferred School subjects recommended – Maths, English, Technology subjects.

### **Pre-Trade Training**

Foundation knowledge for a variety of trades can be gained by completing a pre-trade course at a Polytechnic or private training establishment.

### **Apprenticeships**

Embarking on your career by undertaking an apprenticeship in any of the trades offers the chance to earn while you learn. Options include self-paced learning, and/or block training courses. Ultimately you will gain a National Certificate in your chosen trade.

### **Qualified Tradesperson**

Once you're fully qualified, you can chose to go on to further training or study to extend your skills or work on gaining experience in the industry.

### **Supervisor / Foreman**

As you gain experience, training and qualifications you can progress to become a team leader or supervisor. This could involve supervising and organizing on-site staff and sub-contractors.
