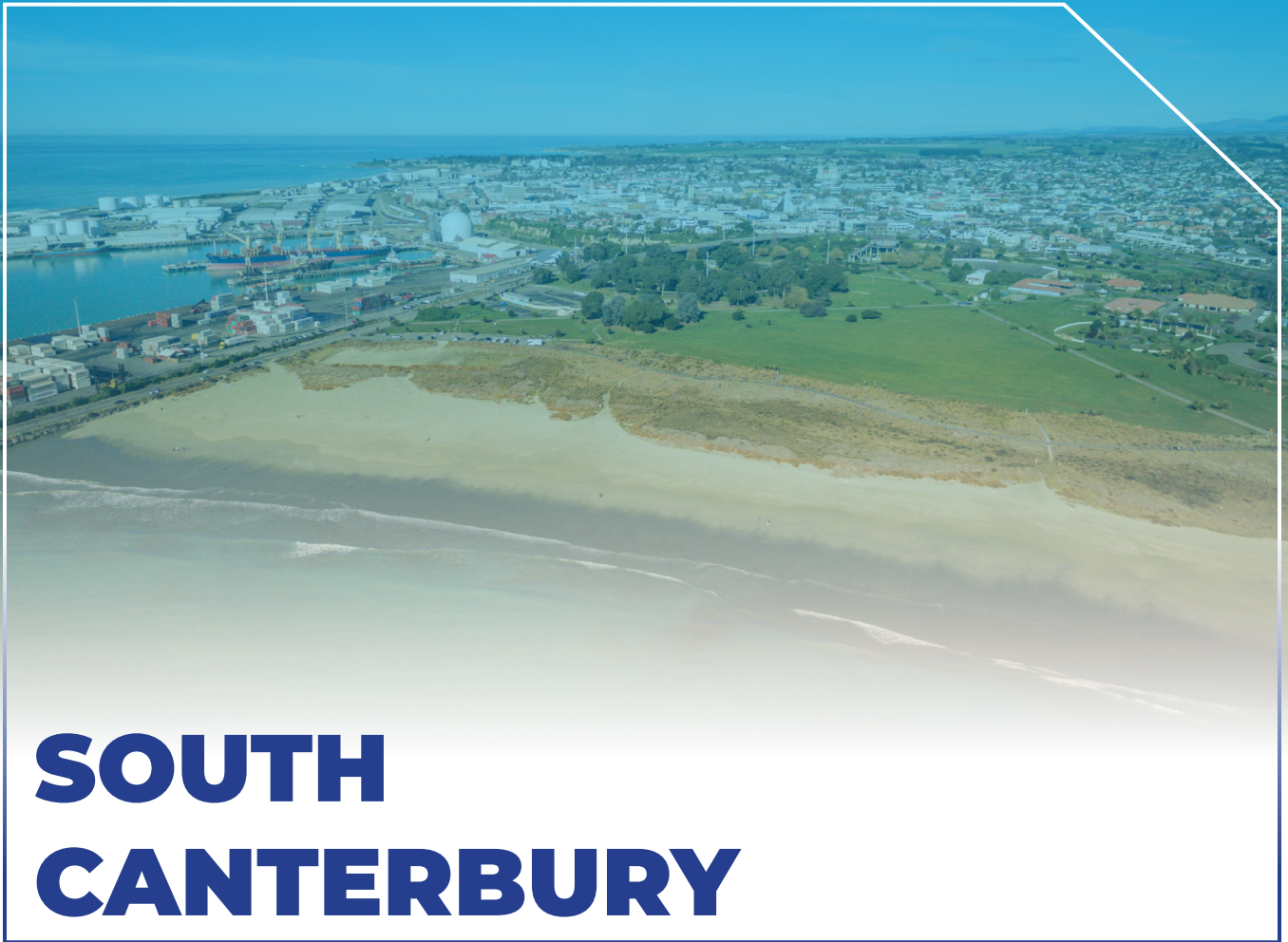




HOSPITALITY & TOURISM CAREERS

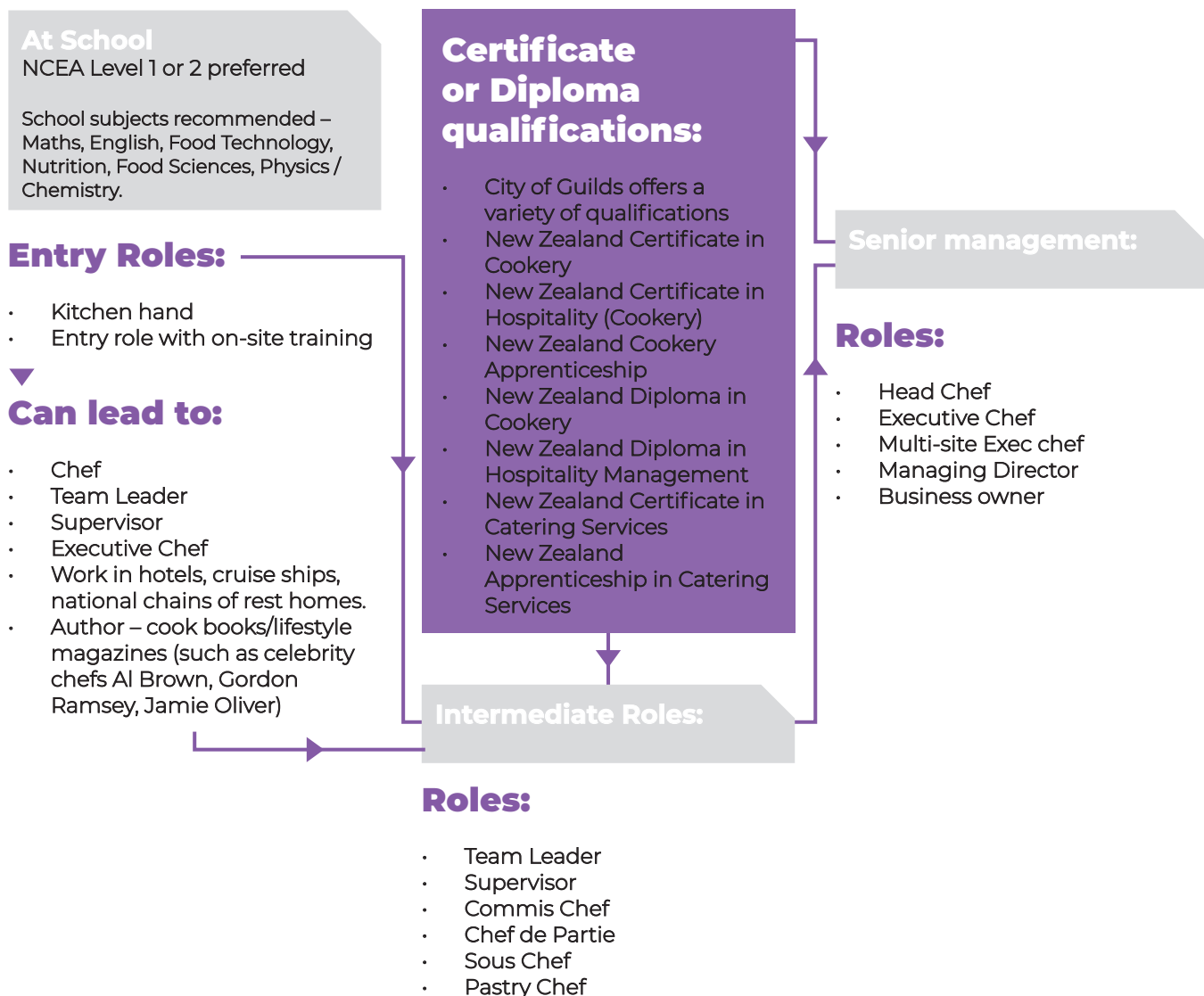

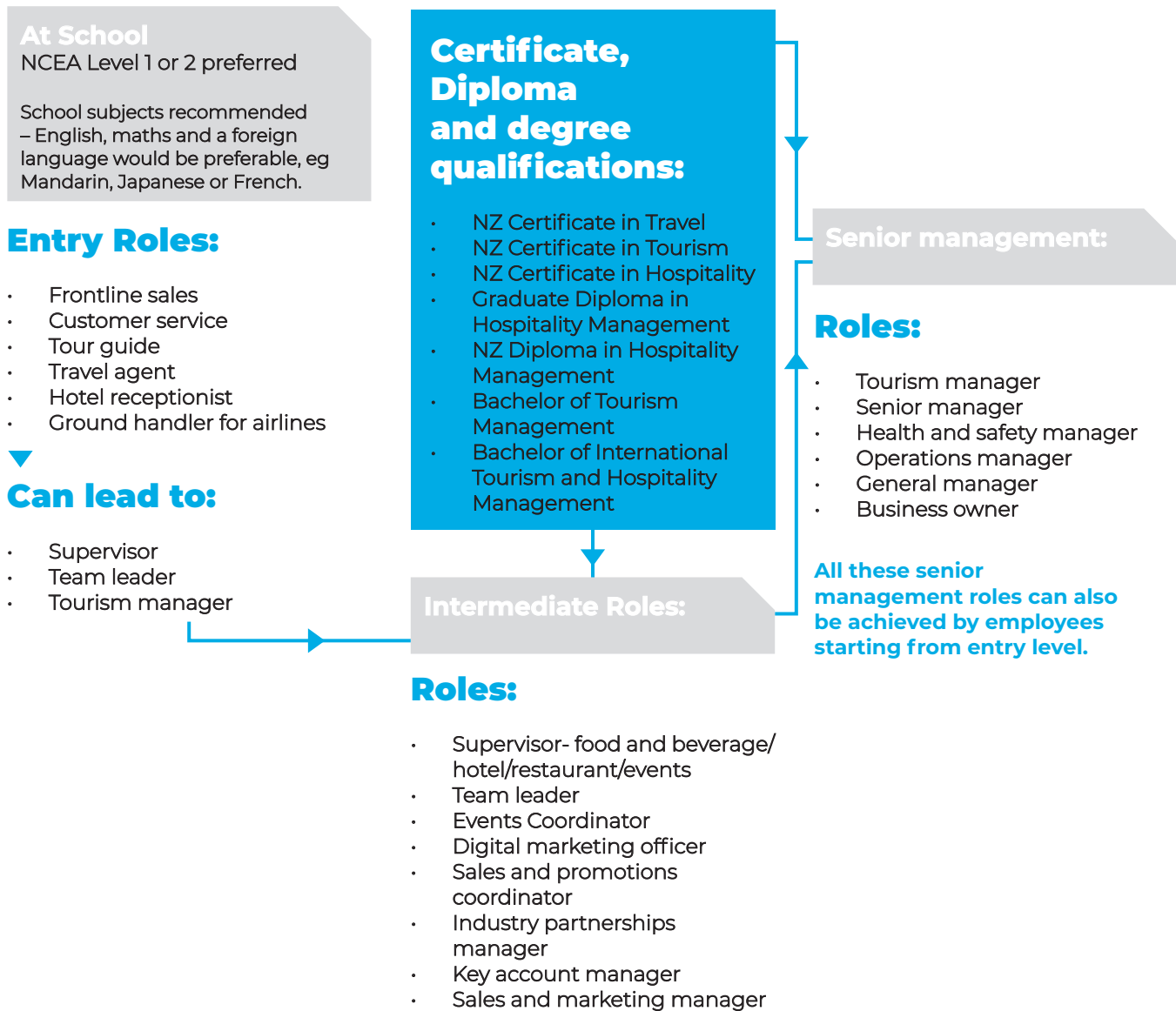
CHEF TRAINING
